

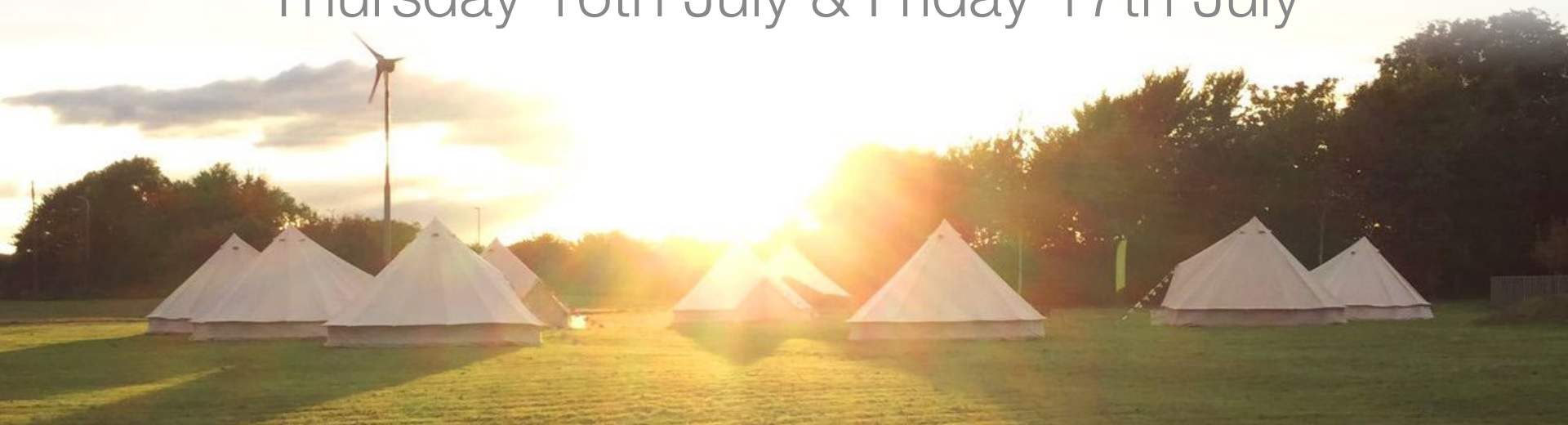

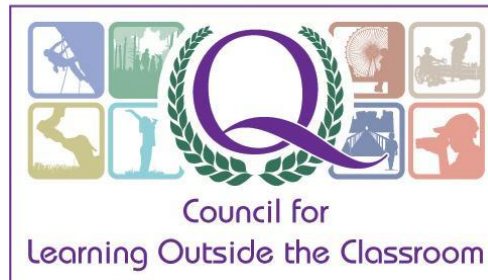

# What Does a Camp Involve?

## LIFE SKILLS

Work together to complete tasks designed to develop life skills, teamwork, communication, planning and initiative.

# Other Activity Options?



## TRADITIONAL FIRE LIGHTING!

Work together to make smoke the old fashioned way using a friction-drill, a traditional flint-and-steel, the sun, and even our giant 15 person strap-drill!



## SURVIVAL BRACELETS

Weave a versatile and colourful Survival Bracelet to keep. As worn by Bear Grylls!



## BUSH BAKING

Learn to bake Bannock Bread over an open fire. For students who've already done Bug Buns and Blazes!



## NATURAL NAVIGATION

Use ancient techniques for navigating in the wilderness using the sun, moon and stars, and learn how to build a magnetic compass.

# Itinerary - 16th & 17th July 2026

- Children are to return to school, after eating dinner, at 5.30pm and should come straight to the year 3 / 4 green entrance gate with their belongings.
- They will be registered, as they arrive, and then taken to the activity camp, which will be on the school field.
- They will be placed into their camp groups and begin their evening activities (which will include hot chocolate and marshmallows).
- The children will then go to bed in their designated tent.
- In the morning, the children will be able to choose from cereal, toast or fruit for their breakfast.
- The children will then complete different activities for the duration of the day.
- The children will have lunch, as usual, on Friday. This may include a school dinner, if your child usually has one. If you would prefer to provide a packed lunch for your child on the second day, you will need to bring it to the school office by 9.30am.
- The children will return to their classrooms and be dismissed at 3.10, following the normal collection arrangements.
- The children's classrooms will remain available for the duration of the trip to refill their water bottles or use the toilets.

# WHAT DO THE OUTDOORS PEOPLE BRING?

# Kit List

## Required

- Sunscreen - for all skin tones
- A sun hat
- Waterproof jacket
- Sleeping bag (3 season if possible)
- Pyjamas or onesie
- Medication
- Wash kit – soap, toothbrush, toothpaste etc.
- Towel and hairbrush
- Torch and batteries
- Warm socks
- Warm hat

- T-shirts
- Warm jumpers or fleeces
- Trousers - preferably not jeans
- Shorts
- Trainers
- Wellies
- A couple of bin liners for all those smelly socks!

# Medicines

If you wish for us to administer prescribed medication, please hand labelled medication to a member of the Year 4 team along with clear, written instructions on dosage.

Any NON PRESCRIBED medicines taken regularly will also require written instructions.

We will be taking ibuprofen, paracetamol and antihistamine. You will be called for permission to administer if required.

Medication must be handed in before **Monday 13th July** .



# Behaviour

We have high expectations of the children and want them to enjoy the experience being provided for them.

To support them, we will be following the school's behaviour policy throughout the camp.

In the lead up to the camp, if children are not meeting behaviour expectations in day to day school, we will seriously consider their place at the camp.

If we deem that a child's behaviour is causing a risk to themselves or others during the camp, we reserve the right to ask for an adult to come and collect them from the camp.



# Payments

The total cost of the camp and activities is £71.

To secure a place for your child, please could a deposit of £21 be paid by **Friday 27th March 2026**. After this meeting, consent and payment options will be open on Arbor.

All payments are to be made via Arbor.

The deadline for the complete payment is by **Wednesday 1st July 2026**.
