

Essential facts about Christianity:

- Christians believe that God created the world.
- Some Christians believe Genesis is literally true where others think it is there to tell them about God as a creator.
- Christians believe there is only one God, but in three different forms: God the Father, God the Son (Jesus)The Holy Spirit.
- Christians believe that Jesus is the son of God. (Incarnation)
- Christians believe Jesus died to save people and take away their sins (Salvation) and that it was all part of God's plan.
- Christians remember Jesus' sacrifice durina Holy Communion (Eucharist/Mass) where they share bread and wine.
- The Bible is the Christian Holy Book-divided into The New Testament and The Old Testament.
- Most Christians worship in churches.

- sacrifice-give up (something valued) for the sake of others
- worship
- Lord's Prayer-prayer Jesus taught the disciples.
- guidance- advice/information to solve a problem or difficulty.
- forgiveness-the act of being forgiven.
