What it looked like last year

- Explore the work of Wassily Kandinsky and Sonia Delaunay
- Identify similarities and differences
- Present findings in an annotated collage including basic life facts
- Create a painting in the style of Kandinsky or Delaunay (child's choice)
- Explore the geometry of Sol Lewitt and Paul Klee art works
- Design and paint a similar work of art.



Sequence of learning

- Learn about the life and work of Georges Seurat
- Create an annotated collage of his art work
- Plan a simple landscape to paint in Seurat's style
- Use stencils and experiment with blending, tinting and shading using dots
- Create landscape paintings in pointillism style.
- Plan a self-portrait and paint it in the style of pointillism
- Evaluate their work and that of their peers.
