As part of our PSHE curriculum, it is a statutory requirement for the school to deliver Relationship and Sex Education (RSE) to the children.

We deliver this as part of our PSHE lessons and content will be covered over a number of weeks, with at least one lesson a week during the second half of the summer term. The curriculum we are delivering is created by the 'Christopher Winter Project' and is quality assured by the PSHE Association. This is the sixth year that we are delivering this content.

As part of teaching RSE, we have to share the curriculum and content that we will be delivering to the children with parents and carers. Therefore, we have created a power point presentation that discusses the content and explains the curriculum we are going to follow, and what your child will learn.
