
### **Year 3:**

<p>The children are expected to read for at least 10 minutes a day for at least three times a week. <b>Please sign your child's reading record.</b></p> <p><b>Read any book of your choice.</b></p> <p><b>Write a book review.</b></p> <p><b>This could include writing about:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>-What your favourite was</li><li>-Who are the characters?</li></ul> <p><b>What was the book about?</b></p>	<p>This week we have been learning words spelt using the <b>igh</b> sound.</p> <p>How many words can you think of that use the <b>igh</b> sound? Make a list.</p> <p>Now put these into silly sentences.</p> <p>Don't forget to include all the things that make a sentence:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• <b>Subject (who or what is the sentence about)</b></li><li>• <b>Verb (action word)</b></li><li>• <b>Correct punctuation</b></li><li>• <b>Must make sense</b></li></ul> <p>Challenge: Use these words to create a wordsearch.</p>	<p><b>Maths homework book page 2. Please sign your child's reading record.</p> <p>Complete 'The Circus' comprehension.</p>	<p>Our spelling pattern last week was:</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Homophones</b></p> <p>Complete the word classification sheet and complete the homophone sheet by filling in the gaps using the word bank provided.</p> <p>There is an alternative phonics and handwriting option that some children may come home with.</p>	<p><b>Place Value</b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"><li>1. Place the missing number in the place value addition.</li><li>2. Subtract 6-digit numbers using the column method.</li><li>3. Order numbers from smallest to largest.</li></ol> <p>There is an alternative option to colour code the numbers based on their place value.</p>
