### Key Terms:

**Polysyllabic** - words with more than one syllable

**Multi-morphemic** - words made up of 2 different words - green + house = greenhouse

**Exception words** - words that don't follow a common spelling pattern

**Pronounce** - say the word (or sound) correctly

**Fluency** - reading accurately, at a good speed with expression

**Intonation** - changing the pitch of your voice up and down when reading

**Context** - The words, sentences or paragraph that surround the word

**Predict** - Make a sensible guess about what might happen next using what you know

**Infer** - Make a sensible guess about a characters feelings of actions based on what you know

**Summarise** - Briefly describe the main points

**Retrieve** - Find information or answers from a text

**Justify** - Explain how you know or why you think something, using the text to help
