


### **Year 3:**

<p>The children are expected to read for at least 10 minutes a day for at least three times a week.</p> <p>Please sign your child's reading record.</p> <p>The children are expected to bring in their school reading book and reading records everyday.</p> <p>Book changes will be made on Tuesday and Fridays each week.</p> <p><b>Write an acrostic poem about animals</b> <b>For example:</b></p> <p>Begins with an egg. Underneath the shell is a caterpillar. Teeth to chew through and come out of the shell. Trying to eat a lot of plants. Each time it grows, it sheds its skin. Reaches a spot on a plant to make a chrysalis. Forms wings and antennae. Leaves the chrysalis as a butterfly. Young caterpillar is gone, now it is a butterfly!</p> 	<p>The focus this week is on spelling words ending with suffix <b>-ment</b> and <b>-ness</b>.</p> <p>Add <b>-ment</b> or <b>-ness</b> to the end of these root words:</p> <p>For example:</p> <p>apart → <b>apartment</b></p> <p>ill → equip → dark → kind → Treat → Enjoy →</p> <p><b>Challenge:</b> Now write a sentence using these words.</p>	<p>Maths homework book <b>page 18</b>.
